

**TOWN MEETING MINUTES
TOWN OF TROY**

March 13, 2024

Selectmen Present: Chair TJ Chasse, Richard Thackston III, Curtis Hopkins

Moderator Thackston opening the meeting at 7:06pm

Moderator Thackston led the Town with the Pledge of Allegiance

Moderator Thackston thanked everyone who helped at the Town Election on March 12, 2024.

Moderator Thackston relayed the Town Election results.

Selectman Thackston made a motion to move the warrant articles out of order and address Article 33 first.

MOTION: Richard Thackston III, 2nd Scott Wheeler

DISCUSSION: Bill Harris questioned why the Town should move the Article. Richard Thackston III explained that the article is very important and thinks that at the end of the night the public might be too tired to discuss at the end of the night.

Moderator Thackston produced a petition that Article 33 be a secret ballot.

DISCUSSION: Bill Harris stated that secret ballots should not be considered as everyone should be able to speak up.

Carl Patten stated that if this Article passes the control of the Water & Sewer Commission into the hands of the Selectboard and thinks that there will be serious issues with that.

Larry Boudwin(sp?) disagreed with taking the power of the Water & Sewer Commission away.

Bill Covenos states that the current Water & Sewer Commission has been learning as they are a new set of Commissioners and is in full support of keeping the current Water & Sewer Commission.

Water & Sewer Commissioner Ben Drugg stated that the Selectboard is three individuals and cannot run the Water & Sewer Commission. He also discussed the Town is in litigation with the Selectboard.

Ben Drugg believes this Article should fail. He stated that the Select Board will not be able to do the job of the Water & Sewer Commission as they are only 3 members, and the current Commission has 5 and he stated that's not enough people to run the Commission currently.

Bill Harris asked Ben Drugg how other Towns structure their Water & Sewer without having a Commission. Ben Drugg responded that this Article should not be voted on tonight.

Larry Boudwin(sp?) stated he came to Troy for the small-Town feel and doesn't want to lose that. Courtney Davis of the Water & Sewer Commission agreed that the Select Board could not handle being the Water & Sewer Commission.

Jody McDermott asked why everyone (Water & Sewer Commission and Select Board) cannot work together.

CJ Hall discussed that the Selectboard was offered to sell the Troy Mills 12 years ago and would have had a better Water & Sewer system so that makes more problems now. He stated he doesn't want to watch the Board of Selectmen screw this up and wants to know how The Town got to this point. He asked why the Water & Sewer issues were not known and why it didn't go through planning. Richard Thackston III responded and stated that the Water & Sewer Commission wrote a letter stating that Water & Sewer could be hooked up and there were no issues with the Mill Water & Sewer system. Steve Sawyer stated he has an objection the Mr. Thackston's comment stated a following letter was sent from the State of New Hampshire stating that new hookups should not be added to the Mill.

Kyle Smith stated that discussion should end and voting on the Article should begin.

**Carl Patten made a motion to move the article to ballot. 2nd Bill Covenor
Majority vote agreed.**

Moderator Thackston announced voting on Article 33 should begin.

Article 33 Petitioned Warrant Article- Water/Sewer Commission

To see if the Town will vote to transfer all powers and duties of the water commissioners, granted by Town Meeting Vote of 1915 Article 15 to the Town of Troy Board of Selectmen.

That vote of 1915 created commissioners and appropriated money 'for the purpose of obtaining water rights and constructing said water works...'

The rights and water works are long completed. The Water & Sewer Commission has stayed in place past the original intent.

The Town Water & Sewer Department, under the direction of the commissioners, is now in costly litigation, dealing with maintenance neglect and water quality issues.

Ben Drugg made a motion to move the warrant articles out of order and address Article 32 second.

MOTION TO OPEN FOR DISCUSSION: Gary Phelps 2nd Bill Covenor

DISCUSSION: Carl Patten stated that this Article is to support the lawsuit. Also stated that the Town and social media has enabled Eric Farris and his lawsuit.

Gary Phelps stated that Eric Farris is not with the Town but is against it by suing for \$2.5 million dollars. Ben Drugg produced an opinion letter from the Water & Sewer attorney stating that this article is illegal, and it was read by Adam Hopkins.

Scott Wheeler stated he voted no on 33 but stated that everyone should vote yes on 32. Also stated the Water & Sewer Commission needs to hook up the water on the Mill.

Debbie Sawyer asked why Mr. Farris has not opted for the original 29 units.

Allan Bailey made a motion to pass over article 32 due to the legal letter from the Water & Sewer Commission

MOTION: Allan Bailey 2nd Gary Phelps
Majority raised hand vote agreed.

Carl Patten made a motion to not reconsider on the vote on art 32.

MOTION: Carl Patten 2nd Courtney Davis

Ben Drugg made a motion to not reconsider Article 33

MOTION: Ben Drugg 2nd Courtney Davis

Article 32 Troy Mills Water & Sewer Fees

To see if the Town will vote that Water and Sewer fees and application process shall be those in place at the time Building Permit was issued to Mountain View Mill at Troy LLC, (the redeveloper of Troy Mills), on August 18, 2022, and that Mountain View Mill at Troy LLC may proceed in accordance with the approved site plan without further application to the Troy Water & Sewer

Department for water and sewer connections and said project does not constitute a "new" water or sewer connection subject to changes implemented by the Town of Troy Water & Sewer Department in January and February 2023.

The Board of Selectmen recommends this article.

PASSED OVER-NO VOTE TAKEN

Article 06 Operating Budget

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Million Thirteen Thousand Seven Hundred Twenty-Four Dollars (\$3,013,724) for general government operations January 1, 2024 to December 31, 2024. Majority Vote Required.

DISCUSSION: Kim Chaffee of the Historical Society asked that the Historical Society's budgets increase to \$13,476 due to work already done at Kimball Hall.

MOTION: Kim Chaffee 2nd Gary Phelps

Majority approves amendment.

Jody McDermott questioned how the money is being spent by the Highways Department, asked about the dam and why stone on Brook St has still not been installed.

Matthew Whooley asked to not reconsider on the Amendment to Article 6.

??? asked about building inspections would like clarification on this \$10,000 appropriation. And also question the Article 22 and how that would affect Article 6. Richard Thackston III explained the purpose of this.

George Maatala if every article passes how much tax rate go up. Moderator Thackston explained that this is not an easily answered question. He also made a motion to decrease the bottom line of Article 6 by 10%. 2nd ???. Also questioned how the Budget Committee has not cut and has matched the Board of Selectmen for the past few years.

Amendment Fails

Ben Drugg agreed that this should be decreased as well and suggested this article this does pass as is. Adam Hopkins explained that the Budget Committee and Board of Selectmen join to come to agreement in the budget process to maintain the Town. Richard Thackston spoke and reiterated this. Courtney Davis asked on behalf of Bert Lang-he would like an interpretation of the Other General Government. Ben Drugg answered that this line item is for tax abatements and any tax errors.

Gary Phelps motioned to move Article to ballot 2nd Bill Coven

Majority vote declines of the 10% amendment

Added \$4,300 to Kimball Hall bringing that account to \$13,476 and total budget to \$3,018,024

Article 07 Sewer Plant Upgrade Bond Payment

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Eighty-Five Thousand Five Hundred Seventy-Six Dollars (\$85,576) for the annual bond payment for Sewer Plant Upgrades completed in 2007. The payment is broken down by principal amount of Seventy-Five Thousand Ninety-Eight Dollars (\$75,098) and interest amount of Ten Thousand Four Hundred Seventy-Eight Dollars (\$10,478). Majority Vote Required.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Thirty-Nine Thousand Dollars (\$39,000) for the annual bond payment for Water Systems Improvements completed in 2010. The payment is broken down by principal amount of Thirty-Two Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty-Three Dollars (\$32,753) and interest amount of Six Thousand Two Hundred Forty-Seven Dollars (\$6,247). Majority Vote Required.

DISCUSSION: Lisa Steadman asked about the Broadband repayment and how it's being paid. TJ Chasse announced Fidium.

Article 12 Cemetery Operating Budget

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Fifty- Three Thousand Six Hundred Three Dollars (\$53,603) and authorize the withdrawal of Fifty-One Thousand Nine Hundred Eighty- One dollars (\$51,981) for the care of the cemeteries and to come from the Cemetery Maintenance Expendable Trust Fund and the Cemetery Perpetual Care Trust Fund. The balance of One Thousand Six Hundred Twenty-Five dollars (\$1,625) to be raised from general taxation. Majority Vote Required.

Article 14 Highway Department Vehicle Purchase

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of up to One Hundred Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$120,000) for the purpose of purchasing a dump truck and all necessary equipment for operation of the Highway Department. And to see if the Town will authorize withdrawal of same from the Highway Department Capital Reserve Fund. Majority Vote Required.

Courtney Davis asked about the same Article last year, TJ Chasse explained that the Article was too specific as to the type of vehicle and so the money was never used.

He also asked about a specific on the equipment that would be included with this purchase. Highway director John Coons explained that the specific vehicles are required to properly take care of the roads of the Town roads.

George Maatala asked what vehicle this would be replacing, Highway Director, John Coons replied none.

Jody Mcdermott asked about the Highway Director, John Coons doing Water & Sewer hook ups with highway equipment. He replied that he has been using Highway equipment to assist the Water & Sewer department.

Gary Phelps motioned to move Article to ballot 2nd Bill Coven

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Forty- Three Thousand Seven Hundred Forty-Six Dollars (\$43,746) for the purpose of purchasing materials towards future road rebuild projects. The funds are to be raised from.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$7,500) to purchase transfer station bags and to authorize the withdrawal of Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$7,500) from the Transfer Station/Recycling Center Special Revenue Fund to offset this expense. Majority Vote Required.

Justine Guay also disagrees.

Richard Thackston III stated historically department heads were unclear as to when/how to compensate for their employees and paying raises before they were voted on at Town meeting.

The remaining balance of Forty-Four Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Nine dollars (\$44,969) to come from the unassigned fund balance. Majority Vote Required.

George Maatala asked if Chief Ellis could explain this purchase and if he would be decommissioning another. Chief Ellis that they need to replace the police vehicle with high mileage.

Jody McDermott asked what would happen to the old vehicle. Chief Ellis explained they would be selling it.

Article 22 Discontinue combined Town Clerk/Tax Collector Potion

To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the combined offices of Town Clerk and Tax Collector effective at the expiration of the current term of the Town Clerk/Tax Collector in March 2027.

CJ Hall asked the benefit of this change.

Richard Thackston III explained clerk is elected and tax clerk is not-and with that the tax collector does not have to live in town and it leaves more options for hiring.

Jody McDermott asked would the Tax Collector be under the Select Board, TJ Chasse answered yes.

Bucky Sheats asked if Tax Collector would have benefits and be full time, answer no by Richard Thackston III. Justine Guay states the new position would cost the town more money, Justine stated that there was always one person doing both jobs, answer no by Richard Thackston stated that they have always had two people in Town Clerk/ Tax Collector office.

Gary Phelps motioned to move Article to ballot 2nd Bill Coven

Article 23 Town Clerk Position

To see if the Town will vote in favor of a three-year term for the office of Town Clerk effective with the end of the term of the current Town Clerk/Tax Collector in March 2027.

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to appoint, pursuant to RSA 41:2, a Tax Collector at the end of the current term of the Town Clerk/Tax Collector in March 2027.

Article 25 Supervisors of the Checklist Stipend

To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate One Hundred Eighty-Nine dollars (\$189) to increase the Supervisors of the Checklist stipend. This vote will increase the 2024 stipend from Two Thousand Seven Hundred Eighty-One dollars (\$2,781) to Two Thousand Nine Hundred Seventy dollars (\$2,970) and remain at that amount annually moving forward, regardless of number annual election events. This changes payment from a per election basis to an annual stipend. Majority Vote Required.

George Maatala asked exactly where the land is, Kim Chaffee explained that it is the piece of land where the new train sits on and has a current lease.

Article 29 Town Hall Buildings

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of Fifteen Thousand dollars (\$15,000) for the maintenance and repair of town buildings and facilities to

include but not be limited to repair, painting of the clock tower, cupola, clock and clock face thereon, critical plumbing, heating, electrical, structural system upgrades improvements and repairs to grading, sidewalks, curbs landscaping on Town Hall and any other Town of Troy buildings and grounds under supervision of the Board of Selectmen. This shall be a non-lapsing Article for up to five (5) years.

Gary Phelps motioned to move Article to ballot 2nd Bill Coven

Article 30 Public Works Director Position Study

Authorize the Board of Selectmen to define, develop, and potentially employ a new position of Public Works Director. Said position would be responsible for the coordination of budgeting, obtaining grants, personnel allocation between all departments, in conjunction with and subordinate to all relevant elected Boards & Commissions involved with physical plant and land operations including but not limited to Troy Water & Sewer Department, Troy Highway Department, Troy Cemetery Department, Troy Recreation Department, Town Common, Conservation Commission as well as any and all parks and publicly owned land and buildings. This study shall not begin prior to July 1, 2024 and requires no additional funds be raised and appropriated in this Budget.

Carl Patten asked the specifics about this position. Richard Thackston III explained that this position would over see all the smaller departments and buildings. Mr. Patten feels this is the Select Board job or the Town Administrator.

George Maatala stated that our Highway Director is our Public Works director and Mr. Thackston responded that that is not the case.

Gary Phelps motioned to move Article to ballot 2nd Bill Coven

PASSED

Article 31 Town Clerk/Tax Collector Office- Clerk Position

Create a part-time clerical position for the Tax Collector/Town Clerk's Office to provide seasonal support on an as needed basis during periods of limited staff availability and/or high demand. This position to be funded in the amount of Twelve Thousand dollars (\$12,000) inclusive of all taxes, Insurance, and fees associated with said position.

Ben Drugg stated that the Town Collector/Tax Collector's office has moved from 2 positions to 4 with this article. He states the Budget Committee does not support this decision. Richard Thackston III stated that this is to cover sick/vacation time etc.

Gary Phelps motioned to move Article to ballot 2nd Bill Coven

Article 34 Petitioned Warrant Article- Building Inspections

To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Board of Selectmen, pursuant to RSA 155-A:3, III (a) and (c), and the Fire Chief, pursuant to RSA 153:5, V, to inspect all newly permitted construction/renovation projects, as well as, all current construction/renovation projects that received a building permit with a specific stipulation requiring inspections; and to further instruct the Board of Selectmen, pursuant to RSA 674:51, I and as formerly decided by the passage of Article 22 of the Troy Town Meeting, to appoint a qualified building inspector or qualified third party to conduct aforementioned inspections for the purposes of enforcement of the provisions of the State Building Code [RSA 155-A]. In the event that a qualified building inspector or qualified third party is not appointed or available to conduct inspections, the Board of Selectmen shall, pursuant to RSA 155-A:7, I and II, request, in writing, that the state fire marshal or the state fire marshal's designee enforce the provisions of the State Building Code [RSA 155-A].

Ben Drugg made a motion to correct typo and also agrees with this article. Richard Thackston III broke down what the article.

MOTION: Ben Drugg 2nd Gary Phelps

Carl Patten stated he discussed this with the Select Board last year. Stated he pushed the Select Board to do this with a Petition to the Town.

Ben Drugg this article was based off a 2022 article.

MOTION: Ben Drugg to amend article 2nd Gary Phelps

Justine Guay asked who pays for inspections, Select Chair responded that the resident pays for the inspections.

Larry Boudwin(sp?) expressed his support on this Article

Adam Hopkins asked about a vote to not hire a building inspector and asked if that had been rescinded.

Ben Drugg asked about the inspection that had been done on the Mill in February.

Motion to not to reconsider Articles 31-34 by ? 2nd Diane?

Amendment recommendation by Ben Drugg to add 2020 to article language to read "as formerly decided by the passage of article 22 of the 2020 Troy Town Meeting"
